The majority of children, who use shoes designed for casual wear to play sports, alarm podiatrists. There is no danger to the foot if a shoe designed for sport is used as a casual shoe, but casual shoes have very little in-built protection for sports use.

The Australian Podiatry Association urges parents to seek advice from a sport shoe store when purchasing shoes for sport use. Specific qualities in footwear design may be required for some sports.

HEAD LICE

We have had several cases of head lice (Pediculosis) in the past weeks. As a health measure would you please check your child's hair for head lice which are dark, flea-sized, mobile and very difficult to see. The eggs (nits) are white and pinhead sized. They are found attached to the hair, usually a centimetre from the root, most commonly at the base of the neck and behind the ears.

Head lice cannot jump or fly. They are usually transmitted through direct head to head contact or by sharing infected items such as combs, brushes, hats and other articles that may have been in contact with the head lice.

As eggs of lice usually hatch in a week, a re-examination of the child's hair after a week should be made to ensure complete clearance.
